THE HAGUE "PALACE OF PEACE."

LONDON, Nov. 26.—The Brussels correspondent of The Times says the Dutch Minister for Foreign Affairs has given some details to the Second Chamber in regard to Andrew Carnegie's offer to provide a Palace of Peace for The Hague Tribunal.

The deed of gift makes over the building and library to the Government of The Netherlands, and stipulates that if the Hague Court loses its original character the building and its accessories shall revert to the Dutch sovereign and the President of the United States, who shall use it in the interest of peace and the comity of nations.
